238th Day

45 - Thursday (16th day in Belgium)

0800 - See FM 2 from Regt dtd 31 Jan 1945. 1 Feb 45 - Thursday

Diepert (897-768)

0935 - Bn S-1 states plan of Bn CO to Regt'l S-3 over phone. Lt. Jones is to bring his mint squad and sweep roads designated to him by the Bn S-1. Troops have already jumped off.

0945 - Col. Bell visits CP and discusses mine fields and etc in the

area of our zone.

1035 - Regt'l Co visits CP and discusses situation and progress.

1206 - Our tanks are approaching check point 85 and drawing arty fire.

Also some dismounted enemy are in front of them. Troops are in vic of ch

pt 85 and are engaged in a fire fight. Lt. Burke is wounded but will not

be evacuated. A path has been cleared of both snow and mines up to and including check point 37. Bn receives 20 replacements.

1255 - Tank O reports he can see forward elements of K company and he will hold what he has. K Company reports to be in between 40 and 85.

1320 - 2nd Bn is attacking ch pt 41 and we are to tie in with them at

check point 81, with E Company.

1330 - K Company now extends from ch pts 40 to 85 and have the tanks with them, with L Company abreast. I Company at check point 38.

1507 - K Company is now at 84 - 83, one platoon at 82 - 81. L Company at 84 and 200 yards back into edge of woods. I Company had one platoon at 84 and 200 yards sach at 85 and the rest at 39.

1545 - L Company takes 16 PsW and are forwarded to Regiment.

1710 - Bn CO and S-3 return from OP and discuss latest situation and our status. We are now in Regt'l reserve and Bn will send 40 men to a Bn rest camp located at Stupbach; ll men from each fille company and 7 from M Company. Men will be able to enjoy hot food, clean and dry clothing and warnth and rest.

The night passed uneventfully and the weather to day was warm and hazy making fighting conditions difficult and progress slow. See Overlay for positions of the Bn. The 4 letter companies have been fighting on German 6 soil since 31 Jan 45. Casualties and evacuations for today:

1800 - The remainder of the day passed uneventfully. Companies still patrol extensively and will continue during the in ht. Patrols during the night reported all quiet and no contact with the enemy. 1100 - Companies will be shuttled to new location by Bn A/T vehicles and organic transportation and L Company leaves for new location.

1530 - Bn CP closes out and moves to new location. 1630 - " arrives at new location at Wilwerdange (775-727). Motor distance covered was approx 13 or 14 miles and we are once again in Luxembourg. Bn awaits further orders and troops are adequately billeted.

1800 - Capt. Bryan returns from schoold in Paris. Weather today was

The night passed uneventfully. I Company was unable to secure the objective due to extreme darkness and difficult terrain and reported back at about 0200. K Company took one PsW in their area. 1500 - Troops are just SE of check point 328. Bn CP prepares to move to new location and a rear CP will be maintained.
