Corporal Nick A. Lovetro, 33566695, Infantry; wounded on 10 October 1944. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.


Private First Class Gordon M. Melson, 37310437, Infantry; wounded on 11 June 1944. Entered military service from Minnesota.
